

- No SAT or ACT are required

California Promise for students that qualify based on financial need.







California State University

- 23 campuses
- One application Application
- Application window October 1– November 30
- SAT OR ACT
- SAT Subject Exams and writing are not required at this time
- NO Personal Statement
- NO Letters of Recommendation
- Cal State Apply California State University

University of California

- 9 campuses
- One application
- Application Window August 1 November 30
- SAT with Essay OR ACT with writing
- *Note: SAT Subject Exams are not used in admission criteria; however, may be required for particular majors

(Engineering)

- Personal Insight Questions
- NO Letters of Recommendation
- UC Application

Private Colleges/Universities

- 500 campuses use The Common Application
- 76 campuses in California
- Testing requirements vary
- Application decisions and deadlines vary
- Cost is higher
- Letters of recommendation are required teacher AND COUNSELOR
- One application for each campus or many colleges use



SAT & SAT Subject Test suggested timelines

SAT Reasoning Test and ACT

- Spring semester of Junior year
- Repeat (as needed or desired) Fall of Senior year

NOTE: SAT and ACT test dates do not conflict with each other

SAT Subject Exams SELECTIVE

- Spring semester of Junior year (exception...after specific subject completion; i.e. AP European History or Pre Calculus or, perhaps, Foreign Language)
- Repeat (as needed or desired) Fall of Senior year

• May of Sophomore, Junior, Senior year
