


## Preparing for High School




- Students receive <u>credits</u> for each class they pass with a D or higher
- Each semester class is worth 5 credits
- You must have 230 credits to graduate
- If students receive a D or F in a core academic course, they will need to recover the class in summer school.



## What happens if my student doesn't pass a class?


- If students do not pass classes required for graduation, they will need to retake them during summer school.
- If they get below a C in an A-G class, they will also need to retake it during summer school.
- We will talk more about graduation and A-G classes on the next few slides.







## What are A-G Requirements?


- Sequence of high school courses
- Required for attending the UC, CSU and some private universities.
- Must be passed with a grade of 'C' or better.

## **Advanced Level Classes**

#### Honors:


Academic classes where curriculum is covered more quickly and with greater depth.

#### AP (Advanced Placement) or IB (International Baccalaureate):

College level classes taken in high school taught by HS teachers. You can take an AP or IB exam in May for the opportunity to earn college credit.

AP classes can be taken throughout your high school years based on your interests & academic strengths.

IB classes do not start until 11th grade.



#### **Dual Enrollment**:

Community college classes taught by college instructors that are taken during high school. Some classes may be offered on your HS campus.

When you pass your IVC classes, you will earn college credit.





# Final Tips for Success


- Buy a planner to help your student with organization and assignment deadlines

## Attendance

- Just 2 absences per month put a student at risk of falling behind, academic failure, being held back, or dropping out
- Students with highest rates of truancy have the lowest academic achievement, greater school discipline histories, and are the most at risk of dropping out
- Being late to school also leads to poor attendance

Good attendance is a major key to success...

- + Average salary in 2017:
  - + \*High school dropouts: Between \$20,000 and \$25,000
  - + \*High school graduates: \$38,150 annually
  - + \*Graduates with a four-year degree: \$67,760 annually
- + \*By middle age, high school dropouts earn \$30,000 less annually than high school graduates

## Attendance Strategies & Tips

- Talk to your student about the importance of attendance
- Check and monitor attendance (parent portal)
- Have a back-up plan
- Be involved
- Plan trips and vacations accordingly
- Communicate with the school

- Encourage connection to their school community
- Plan doctor/dentist accordingly (or get a physician's note)
- Healthy sleep
- Get things ready the night before
- Ask for a meeting
- Understand the laws and school policies
